# INK & INSPIRE: STORIES CO-CREATED, VOICES CELEBRATED

On Teachers' Day, Ink & Inspire reached a meaningful milestone with the publication of 10 collaborative storybooks at an event organized by VOIS in Delhi.

Children from Moinee Foundation's Community Learning Centers across India co-wrote these stories alongside industry expert guests, who joined the sessions through online interactions. Despite being in different locations, participants collaboratively built narratives, imagining characters, shaping plots, and sharing ideas in real time.

Written in the children's native languages, the stories reflected authenticity, confidence, and cultural richness. The initiative placed children at the heart of creation, with experts supporting them as mentors and co-creators.

The resulting books stand as a powerful example of how storytelling can connect geographies, generations, and ideas, transforming learning into a shared and empowering experience.

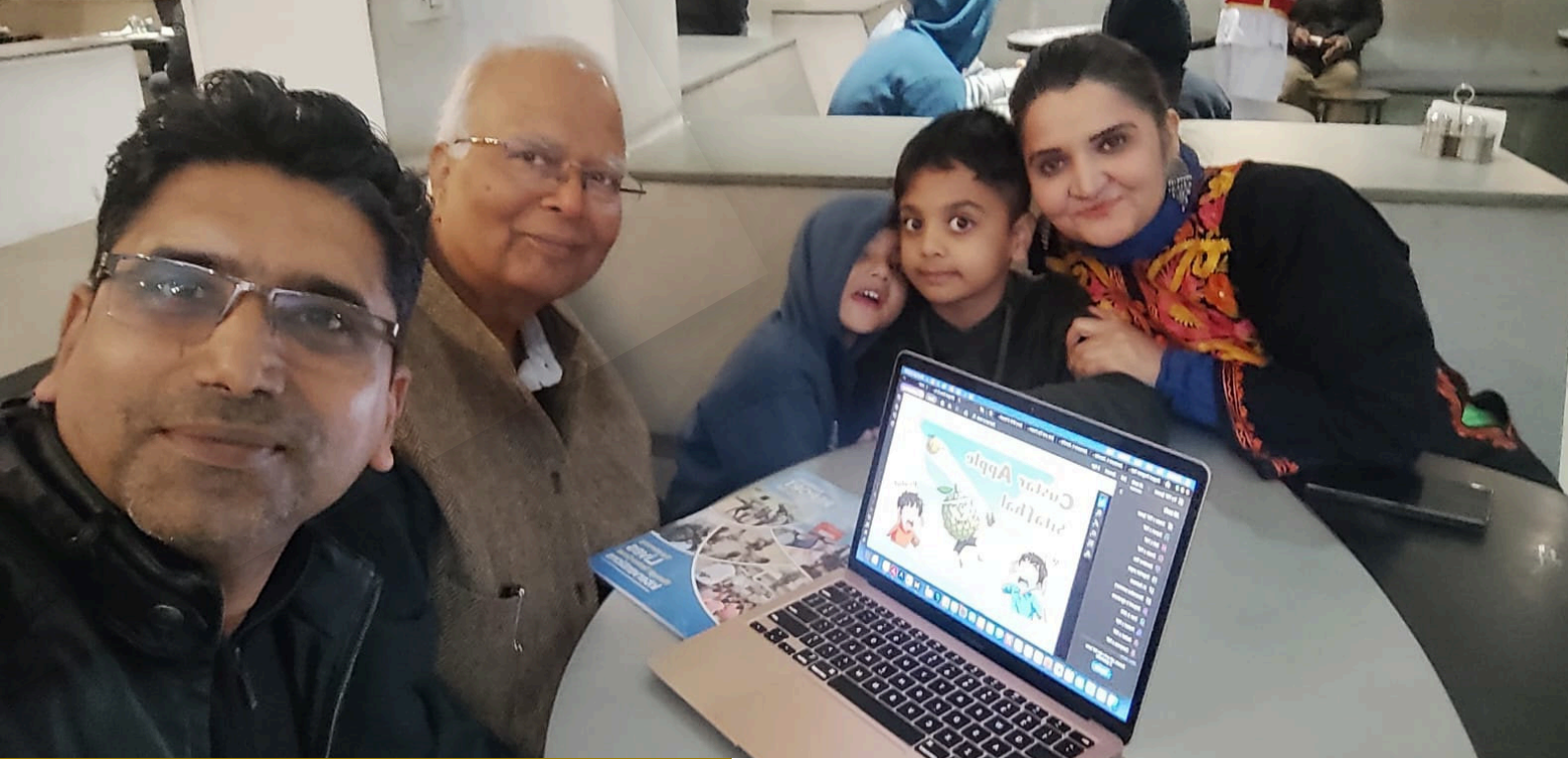


## HANDS-ON STORYMAKING BY JAISALMER GIRLS!

The girls shared their favourite stories and created new ones using the **Promptoo Story Prompt Cards**, exploring imagination and expression through guided prompts. The activity fostered confidence, creativity, and joyful participation, reinforcing storytelling as a powerful means of self-expression.





## INK & INSPIRE AT SHIFT 2025

Ink & Inspire brought creativity to life at the SHIFT event in December 2025, engaging audiences of all ages through interactive story-making using the Story Prompt Card tool.

From toddlers and youth to parents, participants created stories through narration, writing, and drawings. Over 200 unique stories were collected during the event, reflecting imagination, collaboration, and joyful expression.

The initiative transformed the event space into a shared creative platform, reinforcing the idea that storytelling is universal, and everyone has a story to tell when given the right tools and space.



# INK & INSPIRE: WHEN STORIES BRIDGE GENERATIONS

A memorable moment under the Ink & Inspire initiative unfolded when journalist Om Thanvi ji joined his two grandsons, aged 8 and 10, for a story-making experience using the Story Making Tool.

The experience was both joyful and enriching, strengthening the children's confidence and storytelling skills, and reaffirming Ink & Inspire's belief that with the right tools and space, stories can beautifully connect generations.

# Fun Story Making Activity With Yale University Students!

During a recent visit, Yale University students Satoshi Suga, Marceline Yu, and Hekmat Aboukhater engaged with the Ink & Inspire initiative through a hands-on story-making experience using the Story Prompt Tool.

Working collaboratively, the students used the prompts to build characters, settings, and plot elements, resulting in an imaginative story titled "Clowney & the Forgetting Monkey." The activity encouraged spontaneous thinking, teamwork, and creative exploration.

The students praised the simplicity and intent of the tool, highlighting how it makes storytelling accessible while still allowing complete creative freedom. They appreciated the idea behind Ink & Inspire, using structured prompts to remove hesitation and unlock imagination.

The experience reaffirmed Ink & Inspire's belief that storytelling transcends age, geography, and discipline, and that the right tools can bring people together through shared creativity.
